Term Adjunct position Occupational Therapy Program**

Applications are invited for a Term Adjunct position in the Occupational Therapy Program, with responsibilities in OT897, Critical Enquiry Foundations. OT897 is a first-year graduate course, offered remotely and taught in conjunction with PT897, with an expected enrolment of 70 students in each program for a total of 140 students in the combined class. The percentage responsibility for the course is 100%, but the course will be delivered in partnership with the course coordinator for PT897. This position is available from March 1 to June 30, 2022.

The successful candidate will have a degree in occupational therapy or a related profession, a master's degree, and will be eligible for registration in the College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario; at least three years of clinical or administrative experience; and, experience in conducting research. Knowledge of qualitative and mixed methods research will be an asset. The incumbent will be responsible for course coordination, instruction, and student evaluation. The course description follows:

OT-897* Critical Enquiry Foundations (CR 1.5)

This course prepares students for the completion of OT-898 by examining world views, research designs, criteria for study quality, and evidence-based practice. Students develop skills to pose clinical questions, systematically search the literature, appraise scientific articles, and use research to inform rehabilitation practice. (3 credit units) Prerequisite: Registration in the occupational therapy program. Contact Hours: 36
